## **Subject:**

Hong Kong Convention on ship recycling finally ratified

The Hong Kong International Convention for the Safe and Environmentally Sound Recycling of Ships (the Hong Kong Convention) is set to **enter into force within 24 months**, after **Bangladesh** and **Liberia** became Contracting States to the Convention.

The convention was finally ratified by two of the biggest ship-recycling countries after years-long efforts by the IMO to bring them on board.

## **Key requirements**

The key requirements can be summarized in two main points:

- Each ship of 500 GT and above shall have a certified Inventory of Hazardous Materials (IHM)
- 2. **Ship Recycling Facilities** (SRF) shall be **authorized** by their competent authorities and shall **only accept ships** that **comply** with the HKC requirements

The long time needed for ratification of the HKC has caused the **EU to take action**, resulting in the EU Ship Recycling Regulation (**EU SRR**), which entered into force on 30 December 2013 and has been fully applicable since 31 December 2020.

The **EU SRR adopted the requirements of the HKC** as well as some additional requirements. Although the EU SRR is only applicable on a regional level, it has prepared the industry for compliance with the HKC requirements.
